**Instructor Qualifications**

# II. Purpose

To establish regional policy to maintain the right to approve or deny requests of an individual to act as a course Program Director, Medical Director, Clinical Director, Clinical Coordinator and/or Principal Instructor for a North Coast EMS approved training program and/or prehospital care continuing education (CE) provider.

#### III. Procedure

North Coast EMS reserves the right to approve or deny Program Directors, Medical Directors, Clinical Directors, Clinical Coordinators and/or Principal Instructors for all North Coast EMS approved training programs and prehospital care CE providers.

- A. Along with the criteria outlined in Title 22, Division 9 and/or the State Guidelines for Prehospital Continuing Education, North Coast EMS will employ the following criteria to determine an individual's qualifications for becoming and continuing as a Training Program's Program Director, Medical Director, Clinical Coordinator and/or Principal Instructor or CE Provider's Program Director and/or Clinical Director:
  - Current California certification, accreditation, authorization and/or license, which at a minimum meets the qualifications set in Title 22 and the State CE Guidelines for the appropriate level of training.
  - 2. Length of individual's experience in emergency medical care field.
  - 3. Length of individual's teaching experience in the emergency medical care field.
  - 4. Performance of individual while certified, accredited, licensed or authorized.
  - 5. Individual's record of suspensions or decertifications.
  - 6. Evaluations from individual's previous students.
  - 7. Written communication received by North Coast EMS concerning individual's performance in the field or in the classroom setting.

8. North Coast EMS staff evaluations during course on-site visits.

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**Instructor Qualifications** 

- 9. Willingness to comply fully with North Coast EMS policies, procedures, rules and requirements.
- B. If North Coast EMS has reason to believe an individual should not be a Program Director, Medical Director, Clinical Director, Clinical Coordinator and/or Principal Instructor of a training program or CE provider, that individual will be sent a letter stating the reasons.
- C. If North Coast EMS has a reason why an individual should not be a Program Director, Medical Director, Clinical Director, Clinical Coordinator and/or Principal Instructor of a training program or CE provider, possible actions to rectify the problem could include:
  - 1. Reestablishing current California certification, accreditation, authorization and/or license, which at a minimum meets the qualifications set in Title 22 and/or the CE Guidelines for the level of training.
  - 2. Counseling.
  - 3. Remedial training or study.
  - 4. Follow-up site visits and evaluations.
  - Denial, suspension, revocation of approval of Program Director, Medical Director, Clinical Director, Clinical Coordinator, and/or Principal Instructor of the training program and/or CE provider.

# IV. Responsibilities

It is the responsibility of the North Coast EMS approved training Program Director, Medical Director, Clinical Director, Clinical Coordinator and/or Principal Instructor to submit to North Coast EMS a copy of his/her current certification, accreditation, license or authorization to maintain training program status.
